**LINWOOD TOWN CENTRE NEW REGENERATION ENTERS NEXT PHASE**

Tesco and Barr Construction were on site in Linwood this week (16 September) to mark the next stage in the town centre redevelopment. After months of complex demolition and essential preparation work, the project is now entering the first construction phase which will deliver the new Tweedie Hall, new Library, new offices for Linstone Housing Association, and nine town centre shops.

Gloria Coats, Corporate Affairs Manager for Tesco, commented:

“We are delighted to have appointed Renfrewshire-based Barr Construction to undertake our multi-million pound regeneration of Linwood town centre. The community facilities are on track for completion in spring 2014. Once these facilities are open, the next phase of demolition can begin to make way for construction of the Tesco store. The store is due to open in summer 2014.
